Quarter One:

Novel: The Fighting Ground (Avi)

Writing: Narrative Essay

Key Objectives: The student will be able to......

 Apply a wide range of strategies to comprehend, interpret, evaluate, and appreciate the novel.

- Draw on their prior experience, their interaction with other readers and writers, and the knowledge of word meaning.
- Write and use different writing process elements to communicate with different audiences for a variety of purposes.

Collection One – In this collection, you will explore what it means to face challenges fearlessly, even if it means failing in the attempt.

Key Objectives: The student will be able to......

- Identify, analyze, and make inferences about plot in a short story and in news stories.
- Analyze the elements of a myth and to determine themes.
- Understand how the elements of form and the use of alliteration emphasize ideas and meaning in a poem.
- Identify, analyze, and draw conclusions about an author's purpose for writing informational texts.

Quarter Two:

Collection Three – In this collection, you will explore the beauty, power, and mystery of nature.

Writing - Memoir

Key Objectives: The student will be able to.......

- Identify features of a memoir, analyze the style, and write a memoir.
- Determine the theme of a short story and analyze word choice and style.
- Analyze elements of a memoir and its structure.
- Analyze poetic form and learn how poets use figurative language to express feelings and ideas.

Quarter Three:

Novel – Student generated

Writing – Informative essay

Key Objectives: The student will be able to.....

- Apply a wide range of strategies to comprehend, interpret, evaluate, and appreciate the novel.
- Draw on their prior experience, their interaction with other readers and writers, and the knowledge of word meaning.
- Write and use different writing process elements to communicate with different audiences for a variety of purposes.

Quarter Four:

Collection Four – in this collection, you will encounter individuals who must confront a compelling Question: How far is too far?

Writing – Argumentative essay

Collection Five – In this collection, you will take a look at our consumer culture and consider the question: How much is enough?

Key Objectives: The student will be able to.......

- Trace and evaluate an argument.
- Identify tone and evaluate the reasoning used to support a claim.
- Analyze the structure of an informational text and paraphrase central ideas and details.
- Identify and analyze
- Identify cause-and-effect patterns of organization in an informational text.
- Draw conclusions from text and graphs.
- Identify elements of science fiction and analyze the story to determine its theme.
